HURRICANE IKE – Everyone was captivated our by recent exposure to Hurricane Ike. We have much destruction and many evacuees in

our area. These families need our pravers as they work to get their homes, businesses, and families back in order. Many of you have done things to help and I just want to thank you so much. When you think about a storm coming that is as large as our state – you can't help but look at that storm with some awe and some fear. This is a time when no matter how prepared you are nature is in control. Many times I feel this same way when looking at a Walk to Emmaus - no matter how prepared we are as a team I still have some fear that I have forgotten something that has to be done... But when the time gets here you realize that God is so large that we must be in awe of the works he does on these weekends. All we need to

do is be prepared and then step out of the way and let God do all the work. We are called to be servants as we work on the team no matter what our role each is as important as the next. We are one part of a team, but each role is needed to be complete. We are called to be sponsors. As sponsors we are responsible to ensure that the pilgrims are prepared for the weekend, that we have gathered letters. that we bring the pilgrim to the weekend, we are back for candlelight, we sign up for the prayer vigil, we are present for closing and most importantly that we get the pilgrim involved in his/her 4th day to help get them in a reunion group and encourage them to participate in all Emmaus/Chrysalis activities.

Recently I was asked why we have a Board Representative from Chrysalis. Part two of this question was why we don't have Epiphany and Kairos Representatives. I wanted to answer this question in the newsletter because as a manager of employees I have learned over the years if one person asks the question you have others that have thought about it but never asked.

As a community we have decided to sponsor Chrysalis (the teenage version of a Walk to Emmaus). With this commitment there are some things that are required of us as a community by the Upper Room. One is that we have a Steering Committee for at least 3 years. The first year was January 2007. We have one year left for this process then we will be able to split off and elect a Chrysalis Board. Leah Huffstetter sits on the Board of Emmaus as the Steering Committee Chairman and I sit on the Chrysalis Steering Committee as a representative of the GRACE Board. Once we become two boards the Upper Room requests that we each have a representative continue to sit on the others' board. So even after we have a Chrysalis Board someone from that board will sit on the Emmaus Board and vice versa.

The second part of the question wanted to know why we don't have representatives of Kairos and Epiphany on the Board. This is a simple answer. Kairos Prison Ministry was sprung up and supported by the Cursillo Movement. Epiphany is an ecumenical ministry that was modeled after part of Emmaus, Kairos, Chrysalis and other 4th day movements. Neither the Kairos nor Epiphany is sponsored by the UpperRoom which oversees the activities and mandates our actions for both

Emmaus and Chrysalis. A big difference with Kairos and Epiphany from Emmaus/Chrysalis is that we are not considered a ministry. Our purpose is to bring the cream of the crop to Emmaus and Chrysalis to build leaders in our churches to help Christians have a closer relationship with Christ and to grow them closer in their walks with Christ. Kairos and Epiphany are ministries to be taken into prisons to bring people to Christ. BUT with that being said, we have always supported Kairos & Epiphany by having Emmaus members to work in these areas of ministry. I am not sure that you know this but Ray Carden whom serves on our Board is very active in Kairos and Bill Durr is very active in the Epiphany ministry. I am sure we have others but these two people jump to mind.

Thank you for asking your question and if there are other questions that are just eating at you please feel free to ask a Board Member and we will answer the question for you OR find out the answer for you.

BANQUET

We need people to help with Banquet on Saturday Evening. Here is the deal if you are interested in helping serve banquet. To help set up you need to be at the camp site by 3pm if you just want to help serve then be there by 4pm. Wear black (or dark) pants and a white shirt. (Women may wear a skirt; sorry men). No name tags are worn at this event. Remember that if you have a spouse and/or you are a sponsor of a pilgrim you are not to serve at banquet. The men serve the women and the women serve the men.

Women's Walk is first this time so men we need you on Saturday the 11th of October.

Men's Walk is second and women we need you on Saturday the 18th of October.

Co-Ed Servant Team

The question has come up about GRACEmmaus allowing for Co-Ed Servant Teams. There are some general rules that apply in order to work a walk of the opposite sex.

1. If you are the spouse and/or sponsor of a pilgrim on that walk you are not to work as a Servant Team Member for the weekend. Your job is to be the sponsor/spouse. It is distracting to the pilgrim if they happen to see you. And it is not fair to the other pilgrims that are not allowed to see and talk to their spouse/sponsor.

2. If you plan on staying overnight – it is imperative that you talk to your servant team leader ahead of time to ensure that there is a spot for you to stay safely. NO co-ed cabins are allowed; even if you are married.

3. At times we have had some bring their travel trailer for their spouse to sleep in. If this is the case it is your responsibility to check with the camp site to see if they can accommodate you. If any fees are associated with the travel trailer being set up, you would be responsible to pay those fees.

All agape is needed and appreciated: 48 if just for pilgrims' tables; 60 - 65 for the entire team; 36 for bed agape. It is always interesting and inspirational to see what is created by all of you Fourth Dayers! Thanks for ALL that you DO for others!! Gatherings for G.R.A.C.E.

Ballot: Vote for your choice on how G.R.A.C.E. will implement Gatherings starting in 2009. Please vote for only one (1) of the three (3) plans.

PLAN 1

With only one clarified change, leave the Gatherings as they are. We would hold Gatherings monthly (excluding July and December) at varied Churches and Towns all over the district. The change being that we would ensure that the Gathering including the Babe Chick Trainings would be held in a more central location and/or close to the campground at which the Walks are held. We currently hold 8 gatherings a year, not including Candlelights.

PLAN 2**

We divide the Community into geographic fourths (1/4 sections) and have each area hold Gatherings at least Quarterly. The point towns would be:

Tyler / Jacksonville(hold 4 gatherings a year)Longview / Marshall(hold 4 gatherings a year)Mineola / Lindale(hold 4 gatherings a year)Athens / Palestine(hold 4 gatherings a year)

We would have a minimum of 16 gatherings annually with at least 4 being close to your living area to reduce the amount of driving distance. The Babe Chick training would be held at a Tyler / Jacksonville location after each of the Walks for Fall and Spring are completed.

PLAN 3**

We would hold 4 quarterly gatherings centralized in Tyler on a Saturday as a Pot Luck for the full community. Locally we would encourage other towns, or reunion groups, or churches to hold smaller gatherings as often as you like with the following understanding; In order to hold a gathering you would need to provide the space, a 4th day speaker, clergy, and announce/advertise the gathering in the newsletter. All would be welcome to attend but greater emphasis would be placed on advertising for local attendance.

****PLEASE NOTE**: THE BOARD WOULD EXPECT THAT <u>ALL</u> LOCAL GATHERINGS WOULD FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES SET OUT FOR EMMAUS GATHERINGS TO INCLUDE A 4TH DAY TALK, MUSICIANS, AND QUALIFIED CLERGY TO CONDUCT THE ACCOMPANYING COMMUNION. FURTHER INFORMATION AND TRAINING WILL BE AVAILABLE TO LOCAL COMMUNITIES AS OR IF WE PROCEED IN THAT MANNER.



4th Day Praise:

It was Thursday night and I had just walked into a room greeted by applause and hoots. "What had I gotten myself into", I thought. I signed up for a Walk to Emmaus without any information whatsoever. I thought I was going on a "WALK". When I heard I would be cooped up in a room with 80 other guys and have to listen to 15 of them "give their testimony" I was ready to go. I had places to go and things to do. Yes, I was one of those that did not realize my table leader and assistant table leader were team members until closing on Sunday.

My first memory of 4th day was one of deception. I pondered my weekend for several days before it all sank in and then I set about changing my world. The first thing I did was NOT tell my wife or anyone else they needed to go on a walk. To change my world it had to start with me. I changed and others saw the difference in my words and actions.

I got involved in the newly formed Llano Estacado Emmaus community and in a reunion group. It seemed like every month or so the community put on a walk and I served in some capacity or in Community the prayer room. meetings, we were either celebrating "Babe Chicks" or praying for the next team and sometimes both.

I tried not to initiate a conversation with others about Emmaus. I let them ask first. My boys were the first to notice that Emmaus made a difference in my life. When I tensed up about work or family my boys would say, "Dad isn't it about time you worked another walk." They could tell that Emmaus affected me in a positive way.

My middle son, Joe, was the first to go on a Chrysalis, it was the first Chrysalis of our community. Kathy and I served one of the meals and my youngest son, who was 11 years old, wanted to go. I told him he would have to wait until he was old enough. After we left, he got on his bicycle, rode 11 miles from Woodrow to Slaton, TX. He asked around town until he found us. Tim commented, "Nothing is going to keep me away." Tim passed away his senior year in High School never attending a walk, but he changed the lives of thousands as a reflection of his faith and family.

That is the way 4th days should be. We start with our family and move to our block, community, town and we change our world. We create a desire in others to go. We want them to say, "I will not be denied". We live our lives so that others want to know, why and how we changed. We invite those that are in a place in their lives where they are ready to take it up a notch, to move from just a Christian to a Disciple.

I believe that God is still speaking in this world. I believe the Holy Spirit is active today and one of my jobs is "not get in the way". We must listen for the Holy Spirit, know that God has written it on our hearts and it is for good. With discernment and trust, we are vigilantly ready to serve. When we do, we receive a blessing and change our world.
