Camp Gilmont Work Day



- Caddo Hall needs to be cleaned. It is used for kid's camp art and crafts: sweep and wipe down the inside and clean off the front porch. Please bring brooms and cleaning supplies.

A 4th Day Story



I wasn't quite sure what to expect, but I did know that God had something to teach me. While there, I was led to leave my burdens, emotions, and feelings of abandonment, rejection, hurt, "alone-in-the-world" feelings, "I'm not good enough", and the "why was I just not good enough to love" ...

As I surrendered these to God, my eyes were opened to see that I am truly seen, I am heard, and I am certainly loved by my Father. I actually gave the Lord His pen back that I seemed to keep stealing from Him, and decided to let Him finish writing my story that He originally penned long before I ever knew Him. After all He is the Author and Perfecter of my life.

"looking away from all that will distract me and focusing my eyes on Jesus, who is the Author and Perfecter of faith, the first incentive for our belief and the One who brings our faith to maturity, who for the joy of accomplishing the goal set before Him endured the cross, disregarding my shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God revealing His deity, His authority, and the completion of His work. I am reminded that God loves me, and His love will never fail me. He has me safely in His arms. He is going to carry me all the way through the rest of my life and, in the very end, I will rest forever in His loving arms.

Sitting here thinking about activities from the weekend and it's amazing what blessings can be put in front of you if you just let go. It has taken me two strong cups of coffee this morning to come down from the mountaintop experiences back into the reality of this valley. And I'm not uncomfortable here; I know it's just where I need to be today.

Our Pastor had a great message on "God balanced tension". Like people pulling on a tugof-war rope. Yeah, life is like that. But I am learning that when we stay centered and focused and just be in the presence, it's amazing how the tugs of life just make you stronger. I've learned over time (and this was a hard, LONG, way less-than-fun, lesson)... that it's so much easier if you can let go of the "Why is this happening to me?" and opt instead for "What can I learn from this?" "What do you want me to do with this?" "How can I help others from this experience?" Y'all, it makes all the difference in the world. It can change your heart, help you with forgiveness, and actually let you smile again.

One weekend recently, Brad, Blake, and I stood in damp grass, in the dark, holding candles, and along with an amazing gathering of people, we sang to a group of women who walked past with tears in their eyes, a group of women who felt shunned, who did not feel worthy, who had lost so much hope. Our message was to let them know they are loved, they are beautiful, they are gifts of God. And the blessing was truly ours. In the Agape class one Sunday, we stood with a fishing pole, in front of a special family of adults, and we talked about being fishermen. Only, instead of a fishing pole, line,

hook, and bait... we talked of using faith, scripture, and love as a lure. And the blessing was again ours.

God gives us just what we need when we need it. He makes something special and something perfect out of something dark and defeated. God balances tension. Turns coal into diamonds. It's a real thing, y'all. I've learned that when things aren't going the way I want in my life, it's usually because I'm ready to move forward (even if I don't understand it). I have learned to adjust my thinking, find emotional support, stay healthy and positive, and not let my anger, limiting beliefs, emotions, frustrations, and stress keep me from being something I could be. And I grow a little each time.

Wayne Dyer said something like, "When you change the way you look at things, the things you look at will change." We all have the ability to live in peace and happiness, but we have to stop walking the path of fear and struggle. Brad and I have found some ways to remove our stuck emotions through serving and taking time to pay attention to the universe around us. And we truly understand the cliché "What doesn't kill us will only make us stronger"... like diamonds.

What Did Judas Teach Us

The enemy is coming hard. Hold fast.

Easter has come and gone this year. And I'm wondering if we learned anything new. Was it just another holiday or did we notice something different?

Jesus is our greatest example of how to love others. Jesus treated Judas so well that no one was able to detect who the betrayer might be. Judas was even clueless that Jesus knew. But, rest assured, Jesus knew.

If we are to be thankful for everything ("Give thanks in everything, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:18), it might be hard to find how or why to be thankful for Judas. Yes, because of the betrayal of Judas, Jesus paid the cost for our sins. The truth is, if it hadn't been Judas it would have been someone else because God's plan must unfold. He's good like that.

Judas walked with Jesus. Judas listened to and talked with Jesus. Judas ate at the same table, in the flesh, with Jesus. Jesus spoke to Judas and asked him to follow. Judas was welcomed into this misfit family. Judas lived and traveled with Jesus for years. Every day he looked into the eyes of Jesus. With his own eyes Judas saw the miracles Jesus performed.

Jesus gave Judas the ability to heal so he could go out and help others, just as He did for the other Disciples. And still, Judas led the Roman soldiers to Jesus and betrayed Him with a kiss. He kissed the face of Jesus.



God uses Judas to teach us something very valuable; that one can live among Jesus, be up close and personal for years, and still get it wrong. Let that sink in.

The prophet Isaiah says we are "unclean and our righteous works are like filthy rags" to God, Isaiah 64:6. Paul said in his letter to the Romans, "All have turned aside...no one does good, not even one," Romans 3:12. And even Jesus said, "Why do you call Me good? No one is good but God," Mark 10:18.

Scripture is quite clear on this, God is holy and righteous, and our works are not. The moment that we think otherwise we need to revisit what Scripture says is true. "For you are saved by grace through faith, and this is not from yourselves; it is God's gift — not from works, so that no one can boast." Ephesians 2:8-9

"Stay awake and pray, so that you won't enter into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak," Matthew 26:41. When Jesus spoke these Words to Peter, James, and John, He already knew what Judas had done. Jesus already knew the repercussions of Judas' choice. Jesus was very familiar with how powerful the influence of the enemy can be.

We don't know what lies around our corners. We don't know when the enemy is asking permission, plotting, and lying in wait to sift us like wheat, Luke 22:31.

It doesn't matter how much my head knows about Scripture, how smart I may seem about it, if it is never transferred to my heart. I am Judas if I don't get right with God.

Jesus told Thomas in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." God is speaking these same Words to you and me today. Jesus is calling. Can you hear Him? He's there. Just off in the distance, "I am with you. I love you."

There is only One way. Judas was so close yet couldn't see it. Maybe it was his pride that got in the way, or quite possibly his greed. But please don't miss this, friends. It is the difference between eternal life and eternal death. And it has nothing to do with how busy you are on God's behalf. Please don't ignore His calling. That tug you feel is Him wanting you to get to know Him. He knows all about you. And He still wants your heart.

"If you confess with your mouth, Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." Romans 10:9

But friends, believing in historical Jesus or being baptized is a profession of faith. It means I like Christianity. I believe. It doesn't mean I'm living a surrendered life.

One of the most spiritual decisions one can make is to choose to take the journey with God more seriously. We have to choose to submit the leadership of our lives to the God who created the heavens and the earth and everything in it. One might think this would be an easy choice, especially in light of the empty tomb we just celebrated. But this is a decision to begin a journey; long obedience, a commitment to choose Him over everything else, to put His Word first in our lives and live by it.

God has more for us and wants to do so much more through us. I'd love to visit with you about how much He loves you. To God be the glory. In Jesus's name, amen.


