6.	When God starts Blessing you, Mind your Ego.


Our Gatherings

Ephesians 3:20-21 says, "To Him who is able to do far more than we ask, think, or imagine, to Him be all glory, honor, and praise." My prayer and my goal for Walk 107 was that God be glorified in and through the preparations for, and the weekend of, this Walk.



The Emmaus Manual has a quote in it that says, "Pray as if everything depended on Christ; work as if everything depended on you." I had a wonderful year of planning "all the things" for Walk 107. God did a thing! And He gets ALL the glory.


1 Corinthians 3:6 says, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth."
